the Hall Costume awards. Karisu grew some extra arms and helped to keep the competition events running smoothly. John and Chris O'Halloran as usual did an excellent managing stage crew. Betsy, Andy and Carole Parker managed tours around some local favorite spots and Carole also assisted in the masquerade Green Rooms.
